Treasurer's Report

Please recognize the new formatting, this is an introduction to what will be presented at the year end. **Bold items are new**.

Revenue and Expense Statement: Investment earnings are listed below Net Income (Loss) from Operating because we are not using that money to run the church. It includes money we have earned and changes in the market price of our mutual funds. So not all of the investment earnings are in the checking account. Some amounts are gains for financial recording meaning it indicates a change in the market value of the investment. For example, we would have to sell and draw down money to recognize this as cash available to spend.

Balance Sheet: We have combined the investments that were previously listed separately from the general fund financials. This allows one place to reflect all of the general fund assets. The line Due to church from Cemetery Fund is an amount we will collect from the cemetery fund for the church paying for the lawn mowing expense of both the church and the cemetery. Liabilities: The church received grants for both Manse repair, \$7,000, and Stewardship conference expenses, \$3,150 some of which came in the month of August after these financials were printed. These items are listed as liabilities because we will only use that money for those purposes. As of July 31st, about half the bills were paid for the Stewardship conference before the revenue came to the church in August. That is why there is a negative number there.

Treasurer's Report (continued)

You will see from the negative Net Income (Loss) from Operating that the church's expenses are more than what is being collected from congregation members by \$9,443. Even though we have only spent 37% of our budget for 58% of the years' time, we are not breaking even! Session budgeted for more expenses than last year because we planned for hiring a Pastor and those expenses were estimated. Had we needed to spend what we budgeted our losses would have been worse than the nearly -\$10,000 of July 31st. So, income from contributions are not enough to cover regular expenses. This is concerning for the long term existence of our church. There are two ways to fix this, congregation members give more and/or the congregation works to increase membership by recruiting new members so we have a sustainable plan for the future of our church.




A minister told his congregation, "Next week I plan to preach about the sin of lying. To help you understand my sermon, I want you all to read Mark 17."
