Treasurer's Report

As of November 2018 the church has taken in \$60,557 in contributions and paid out \$78,339 in expenses. We have a net loss from the cash taken in to the cash paid out of \$17,581. This is our net ordinary income. Budget to actual expense are under budget. As Doris, Pastor Murphy, and I heard at the Stewardship Conference, if our church intends to grow we would expect to see expenses meeting budget. Revenue budget to actual is not available because we did not ask for expected contributions last year.

The church has cash and investments in the amount of \$485,964. Liabilities of \$6,498 most of which is the money granted to the church to fix up the manse (meaning it can *only* be used to fix the manse). Under other income/expense on the Revenue and Expenditures report, the church benefitted from market gains this year. The interest recorded from the Hutch Co-op, dividends, interest and unrealized gains from our investments is not cash in our bank account - it is invested with New Covenants. We would have to sell those investments to be able to use that income, so it is represented as other income.


