

# Treasurer's Report (continued)

Church Financials as of September 30, 2020. The church profit and loss report shows contribution and per capita revenue of just under \$40,000. On a more typical year we would expect to take in around \$80,000 to \$90,000. The church has received 43% of our anticipated revenue so far this year.

Expenses were budgeted high in anticipation of hiring a permanent Pastor and implementing a plan to start expanding our congregation. The expense budget for the year is \$150,500. We have spent just under half of this in nine months. As of September 30th, there is a net loss. \$40,000 in revenue less \$72,400 in expenses is a net loss of -\$32,700.

Other Income includes our investment revenue. Market gains have increased the investment balance as of September 30<sup>th</sup> by \$27,400. This increase is reflected in the balance of our New Covenant and Hutch Coop balance sheet accounts. If we add our gain in the investment markets, we have a loss of -\$5,331.

A forgivable loan (Paycheck Protection Plan SBA forgivable loan) was applied for this Spring to help offset the costs of salaries and benefits. This came to \$10,700. The money was received and has been helping cover the costs which allowed us to use much less from savings. An application to have this forgivable loan removed is in the process. Once we receive notice of the acceptance, the \$10,700 that shows as a liability on the balance sheet will be removed and grant revenue will be recorded.

McLeod County has also offered grants to help offset costs of utilities and some of the video streaming costs the church incurred so we could televise services over the internet. We hope to know in November the amount we will receive against those costs.

The balance sheet shows there is just under \$5,000 in the checking account and we have \$10,400 in savings. These numbers are down due to less offerings and per capita giving coming in. We have not yet had to transfer any of the \$558,000 out of investments to cover expenses.




